Leader/Speaker <ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ Speak for the team✓ Make sure everyone is working✓ Keep everything organized✓ Double check all of the votes	Writer <ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ Fill in all of the charts✓ Write down all of the information and ideas✓ Write the tallies and counts
Pass Out Votes <ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ Pass out the voting slips✓ Make sure everyone gets only one slip of paper✓ After the Pick-Up Person says the choice on the slip, put it in that stack.	Pick Up Votes <ul style="list-style-type: none">✓ Pick up the voting slips and place in the bag✓ Make sure you pick up ALL of the voting slips✓ Pull the votes out of the bag one at a time and say the choice
